Literacy: Students will improve their writing in the areas of generating ideas, organization and conventions. Teachers will use mentor texts and explicit instruction to support students' writing.

Mathematics: Students will begin to see and make connections between what they are learning and

real life experiences. Teachers will provide multiple opportunities and ways of showing their learning

(assessment practices) and will begin classes with multiple questions and entry points.

Well-Being: Students will develop how to socially interact with others in an appropriate and respectful way when in school. Staff will model, teach, and provide opportunities for learning. The school will build school spirit and recognize students' academic achievement and will create new pillars to recognize the whole student. Math extra help is offered on Wednesdays for students in grades 7-9.

Professional Development

The Literacy team took part in a lunch & learn and afternoon PD with our Literacy Consultant. The focus was on improving students' writing, specifically generating ideas. Teachers will explicitly teach/model this and provide more time and opportunities for writing. Math consultant and PD is scheduled for Nov. 26th to support the math teachers to help improve students' mathematical understanding.
