Business Arising from previous minutes:

- Update on sports bins equipment was cleared from the roof of the school, so the bins are somewhat replenished. - Craig Upshaw Anti-hate / racism presentation BJHS students Wed., October 25 and Parents/Guardians Thurs., October 26. Parents were sent feedback on the presentation.
- ➤ November 13 World Kindness day will be celebrated



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- > YMCA presenter will be working with grade 7s to discuss the impact of racism in the media.
- SchoolsPlus also coming in to work with grade 7s and Grade 8 boys.
- A group of 10 students will be going to the Headstrong Summitt Building Capacity in Youth to discuss mental health in a positive way and provide support to peers.
